It was forty years ago today...

Sgt. Pepper taught the band to play. Rolling Stone first appeared on the news stands. The Green Bay Packers won the first Super Bowl. And Northwestern Mutual's Internship Program first launched.



The world has changed much since then – and so has our internship. In 1967, 36 college teams and 155 interns participated. This year more than 300 teams and 1,800 interns are involved.

Since 1967 more than 22,500 individuals have entered the program. And for 12 straight years, Vault, Inc. (formerly The Princeton Review) has named the Internship Program one of America's top 10 programs.

This timeline captures many of the milestones that have shaped where the program is today.



1967

1969



- President Francis Ferguson approves \$100,000 (\$550,000 today's \$) to pilot a program to learn as much as possible about the financial aspects of getting a college unit started: the eight "experimental units" include North Carolina State, University of Massachusetts, Michigan State, Oklahoma City University, University of Mississippi, University of Maryland, St. Louis University, and the University of New Mexico
- ARPANET, the precursor of the Internet, goes online
- Neil Armstrong becomes the first man to walk on the moon





1994


- Bonnie Blair, five-time Olympic gold medalist in speed skating, is the guest speaker at the College Awards Dinner


